From the Pastor

2025: A HOLY YEAR. Last year, on the 3rd Sunday of Advent, I offered the first of my year-long series-to-be about the Holy Year 2025, also called a Jubilee Year. It officially begins when the Pope opens the Holy Doors at his Cathedral, the Lateran Basilica Cathedral of Saint John in Rome. The other 3 Roman Holy Doors are: Saint Peter Basilica, Saint Mary Major and Saint Paul-Outside-the-Walls. These are the only **MAJOR** Basilicas; passing through their Holy Door, and fulfilling the other requirements which will be explained in future articles, gains one a plenary indulgence. If all goes as planned, the first door will be opened on Christmas Eve, Tuesday, December 24, 2024, and will close on the Epiphany, Tuesday, January 6, 2026.

BRIEF HISTORY OF JUBILEES. Jubilees come from the Jewish custom of making every 50th year [7 weeks of years = 49] a Jubilee. The instrument that signaled its start, a ram's horn, or 'yobel,' proclaims the start of Yom Kippur or The Day of Atonement. Christian Jubilees may have begun in 1200 when many pilgrims came to Rome to mark the start of a new century. In 1300, many came to Rome again; rumors of a special Papal Blessing bestowed on pilgrims to Rome in 1200 led Pope Boniface VIII, after concurring with his Cardinals, to grant special blessings to all who came to the tombs of the Apostles Peter and Paul to mark a new century - and a new tradition was born. In 1343, Pope Clement VI reduced it to every 50 years; in 1470, Pope Paul II lowered it to every 25 years.

HOLY YEAR 2025 THEME & LOGO. As seen in the logo above, Pope Francis chose as the theme of this 'ordinary' Jubilee 'Pilgrims in Hope' - for we are all on an earthly pilgrimage, hopefully to heaven. Despite all the bad and sad news we endure every day, we are called to be people of **HOPE**. This is Pope Francis' **second** Jubilee; in 2016, he proclaimed an **extraordinary** Jubilee - **The Year of Mercy** - to help us to better understand - and avail ourselves to - the Sacrament of Penance, and to be more forgiving of others, of ourselves, of the Church - which dovetails with the theme of the Holy Year 2025.

The Jubilee Logo shows **four stylized figures**, representing all of humanity coming from the four corners of the earth. They **embrace** each other to indicate the **unity** and **fraternity** which should - and must! - unite all peoples. The **rough waves** recall how our pilgrimage through life is not always easy or serene; we often face turbulence and tribulations as did Jesus on that 'sinking boat' with His anguished Apostles. The **anchor** is the symbol of **hope**, based on a biblical quote: "We have [hope] as an anchor of the soul, sure and firm, which reaches into the interior behind the veil, where Jesus has entered on our behalf as forerunner, becoming high priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek." [Hebrews 6:19-20] The Cross bends down towards all humanity, for Jesus has not left us orphans [Cf John 14:18] but is always reaching out to us, especially through the Sacraments, to offer us the certainty of His presence and the security available to all who place their hope in Him.

Like the Great Jubilee of 2000, which began a new millennium, a variety of 'individual' Jubilees will highlight different groups. The first will be from January 24-26: the Jubilee of the World of Communications. Others will focus on: Teenagers, Children, Parents and Grandparents - Musicians - Health Care Workers - Police and Military Personnel - Deacons - Bishops - Eastern Rite Churches - Marian Spirituality - Consecrated Life - Missionaries of Mercy - and, lastly, on December 14, the Jubilee of Prisoners, to whom Pope Francis has been most solicitous. As these 'individual' Jubilees draw near, I will devote my article to that particular group.

The Holy Year will emphasize the importance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus asked his disciples to continue his forgiveness ministry. Jesus told Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:19). And after the resurrection, Jesus breathed on the disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them" (John 20:22, 23). Make sure you avail yourself of this great sacrament.
