Today's Readings & Gospel

Reflections by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Reading I: Micah 5: 1-4a

The announcement of a new David coming out of Bethlehem to restore his kingship is indeed a great joy. The "Little Town" will suddenly become big in the history of Israel and of the world in general

Reading II: Hebrews 10: 5-10

The author quotes Psalm 40, which enunciates the fact that God prefers our obedience to ritual sacrifices. Christ's obedience is the perennial model.

The Gospel: Luke 1: 39-45

The physician-evangelist continues his narration of the dawning of the great fulfillment of God's promise. This visit of Mary is not to be taken literally, since it strains credulity that a 14 year old pregnant girl would undertake a 4 day journey alone over mountainous territory. Instead it brings Luke the opportunity to bring the two mothers-to-be together to praise God and to show how Elizabeth's son is the precursor of Mary's Son.



THE CHRISTMAS TREE.

Numerous legends and myths offer insights into the custom of bringing evergreen branches - and even whole trees - into homes and other places and decorating them. Ancient Romans brought branches that 'stayed alive' all year round 'inside' to 'keep the gods' close at hand. Some

formed them into wreathes as a sign of eternity. Modern Christmas Trees have their 'roots' [pun intended!] in Germany; in 1923, the USA's 'National Christmas Tree' had lights added by the 'Electricity Lobby' to promote their-then 'new-fangled' product! At first, most ornaments were edible, but Christian symbols: a Star of Bethlehem or Angel atop the tree made it a religious relic, and holy symbols were added as a teaching tool to help children learn the true meaning of Christ's Nativity at Christmas. So it is only right [and catechetical] that we bless our Christmas trees using the follow Rite from the Catholic Book of Blessings.

Order for the Blessing of a Christmas Tree

All gather around the tree and sing a suitable Christmas carol; then, the leader makes the Sign of the Cross as all do the same and reply, "Amen."

leader: "Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever." all: "Amen."

leader: **Amidst many signs and wonders, Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: His Birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light.**

reader: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to Titus. When the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life. The word of the Lord. all: **Thanks be to God.**

leader: **Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord.**

all: "Lord, give light to our hearts."

reader: **That this tree of lights may remind us of the tree of glory on which Christ accomplished our salvation; we pray: [r]**

reader: **That the joy of Christmas may always be in our homes; we pray: [r]**

reader: **That the peace of Christ may dwell in our hearts and in the world; we pray: [r]**

leader: **Together we pray: Our Father ...**

Then, with hands joined, the leader prays:

Lord our God,
we praise you for the light of creation:
the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night.

We praise you for the light of Israel:
the Law, the prophets,
and the wisdom of the Scriptures.

We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son:
he is Emmanuel, God-with-us,
the Prince of Peace, who fills us
with the wonder of your love.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us
as we illumine this tree.

May the light and cheer it gives
be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts.

May all who delight in this tree
come to the knowledge and joy of salvation.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The lights of the tree are then illuminated.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the Sign of the Cross and saying:

May the God of glory fill our hearts with peace
and joy, now and forever. Amen.

The Blessing concludes with the singing of
another Christmas carol or Advent hymn.

May these simple yet poignant Blessings help all of us to 'Keep Christ in Christmas' and instill in our hearts and homes the compassion, mercy, forgiveness, understanding, love and peace of Jesus. Merry Christmas and a most blessed, happy and healthy Year of our Lord 2022!
