From the Pastor
4th Sunday
of Advent - C
December 22, 2024

THE JUBILEE HOLY YEAR 2025. This is the 3rd of our multi-year-long series on Jubilee Year 2025. [The 1st was on the 3rd Sunday of Advent 2023, and the 2nd was last week, the 3rd Sunday of Advent 2024.] We'll continue to explain what a Jubilee Holy Year is, and its customs and traditions that seek to help us become better Christians. [As always, past bulletin articles are available on our parish website.]

THE OPENING/CLOSING OF HOLY DOORS. This Jubilee Year begins when the Holy Doors at Saint Peter Basilica are opened by the Pope on December 24; these special doors, which are usually literally cemented shut, were last opened for the extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy in 2015-2016. In past Jubilees, each Diocese was encouraged to open Holy Doors in their own Cathedral and other special Churches, but that is not being encouraged this time. On December 29, the Feast of the Holy Family, the Holy Father will open the Holy Doors of his Cathedral: the Basilica of Saint John Lateran, Europe's oldest Church. All Dioceses are encouraged to begin their Jubilee Year events on that same day as a sign of the Church's unity, like designating their Cathedral or other Shrines as pilgrimage sites.

On January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, the holy Mother of God, the Pope will open the Holy Doors at the Basilica of Saint Mary Major, the oldest church dedicated to our Blessed Mother in the West. On January 5, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, he will open the Holy Doors at the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside-the-Walls. These are the only 4 MAJOR Basilicas in the world. The Pope hopes to open a Holy Door in a prison, since the year of the Lord's favor is when liberty and release are proclaimed to captives and prisoners [Cf. Luke 4:18]. This Jubilee Year concludes in local Dioceses on the Feast of the Holy Family, December 28, 2025, and in Rome on the Epiphany, January 6, 2026.

WHY A HOLY DOOR? *Scripture* often refers to Jesus as the 'passageway' to salvation; going out of our way to pass through a *Holy Door* or visit a *pilgrimage site* can help us a redirect our lives to more closely follow Christ. Here are just a few

biblical quotes: "I am the way ... No one comes to the Father except through me." [John 14:6] - "I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved ..." [John 10:9] - "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. [Matthew 7:13] - "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me." [Revelation 3:20] These powerful images remind us that to safely arrive at our desired destination: heaven, we must enter through the designated doors by Jesus, not like thieves who tried to steal their way in, only to be thwarted and condemned!

WHY SO FEW HOLY DOORS THIS TIME? We do not know why the Holy Father chose NOT to allow countless Holy Doors, but here are my thoughts, based on my experience of the Great Jubilee Year 2000. Back then, each Cathedral, and many Parishes and Shrines erected a Holy Door and encouraged people to pass through it to receive special graces. To many, it smacked of superstition and 'magic.' To travel to the Eternal City and pass through the Holy Doors of the 4 major basilicas and to then take in all the sites within them can be a grace-filled act, like any major pilgrimage can be. But to pass through a makeshift 'Holy Door' in places we often visit, and do nothing else, seems almost silly. So, it seems, the preference is, when making a local pilgrimage - not to simply pass through a 'Holy Door' - but to pray, fast, give alms - and, above all, worthily celebrate the Sacraments.

HOW CAN WE BETTER FOLLOW THE WAY? Encourage those who are not Baptized, Confirmed, and prepared for First Eucharist - and those who have not had their children prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation - to do so. Have Marriages that are not recognized by the Church convalidated - seeking a Declaration of Nullity and/or Annulment if necessary. PLEASE speak to a Priest or Deacon to get the correct details of what is needed and how to proceed! Go to Confession. Attend Eucharistic Adoration, Daily Mass, Lenten Devotions, etc. Our church doors may not be holy, but you can be - by passing through them more often! Merry Christmas!






