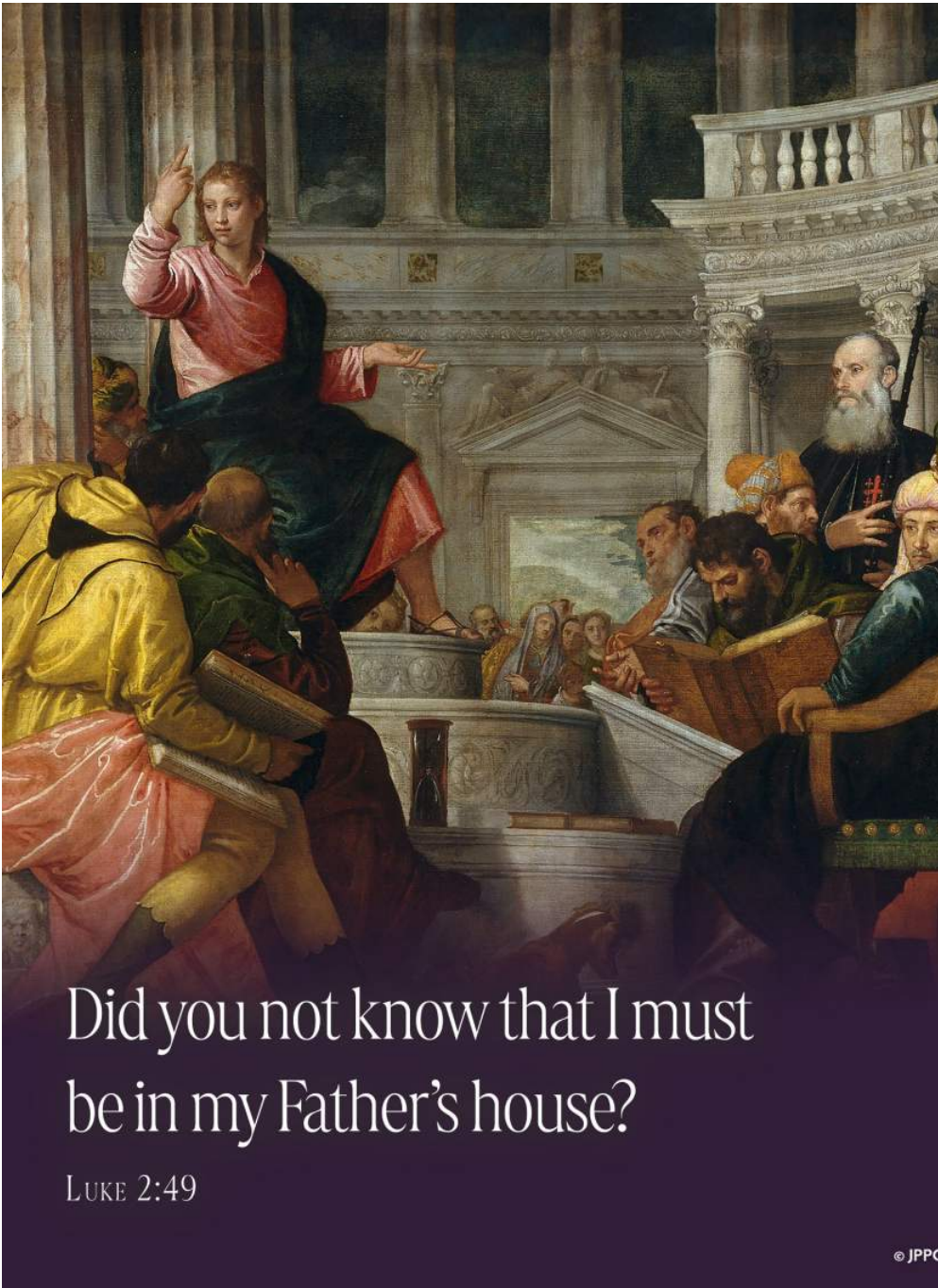

**WHERE IS THE POPE'S CATHEDRAL?** Some, if not many, incorrectly assume the Pope's Cathedral is Saint Peter Basilica. However, the Bishop of Rome's cathedra - the chair a Cathedral reserves for use by the Bishop of that particular Diocese - and any other Bishop to whom he grants permission - is in the Basilica Cathedral of Saint John Lateran. Its formal name is a mouthful: The Papal Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and Saints John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran. For the rest of this article, it will be shortened to BCSJL, which is also the Catholic Church's 'Mother Church' Why ...?

**A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE BCSJL.** Due to the violent persecution of the Infant Church, there were no public houses of worship or clerical residences; that all changed with the Peace of Constantine in 313 AD. The Emperor 'legalized' Christianity and gave her a palace on one of Rome's seven hills, the Lateran Hill, named for the noble Laterani family who owned it. Pope Sylvester I [Feast Day: 12/31] made it the Bishop of Rome's Cathedral and central offices in 324 - so, it just celebrated its 1700<sup>th</sup> Anniversary! Our first official 'Church' - thus, our 'Mother Church' - was also the papal residence until the Pope moved to Avignon, France, in 1309. In 1377, Pope Gregory XI returned the papacy to Rome, but two fires, in 1309 and 1361, had badly damaged the BCSJL. So, the Pope moved to the Vatican Hill, to a basilica built by Constantine in 329 over what was said to be Saint Peter's grave. [Modern excavations strongly suggest he was correct!]

The original Lateran Basilica, aptly dedicated to 'Christ the Savior' in 324 was torn down in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century; its current façade was completed in 1735. In the 10<sup>th</sup> Century, it was rededicated to Saint John the Baptist, and in the 12<sup>th</sup> Century, Saint John the Apostle/Evangelist was added. Thus, its long name: The Papal Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and Saints John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran. [Adding the prefix 'arch' to Cathedral, Diocese or Bishop designates them as of greater status or importance.] So, while the place of the papal residence and his administrative offices have moved to the Vatican, his cathedra is still at the Lateran, where Popes also lived for more than 1,000 years.

**SIGN OF THE CHURCH'S UNITY/RESILIENCE.**

This sacred site on the Lateran Hill has quite a story to tell. Despite fires and floods, decay and desecration, erosion and ecclesiastical ignorance by those who - with good intention, as they had her repaired and renovated, did irreparable damage to her - she still stands! She even survived the onslaught of armies who marched against her - and, as recently as 1993, a bombing, which 'may have' been caused by the mafia after Pope Saint John Paul II criticized a Sicilian group. To this day, the Pope or his representative goes there to lead the OCIA: the Order of Christian Initiation of Adult's Rite of Election slated for the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent, which ideally occurs in every Cathedral in the world on that day.

The Church's resilience is also seen in a most ironic way. The great doors of the BCSJL were taken from the ancient Roman Forum. Since then, she has seen many monarchies and nations, peoples and cultures come and go, yet she remains and is still growing! For as Jesus said: "... upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." [Matthew 16:18]

**TOMBS OF SOME POPES.** The remains of the earliest Popes buried in BCSJL have been lost to history; two Successors of Peter interred there deserve special mention. When Saint Francis of Assisi sought the Pope's permission to start a new Order, Pope Innocent III [reigned 1198-1216] dismissed his Franciscan Rule as too extreme. But after having a dream in which Saint Francis held up the BCSJL, he granted permission. The last Pope not buried in Saint Peter Basilica was Pope Leo XIII [reigned 1878-1903]. [Not for long though; Pope Francis will be buried in Saint Mary Major which he has visited over 100 times, after each papal journey.] During Pope Leo's papacy, there was still tension over the Papal States, and he never left the Vatican. Since a Bishop's place is in his Cathedral, Pope Leo got there, but only in death, as he chose to be buried in the BCSJL.

As all Bishops and Catholics symbolically join with the Holy Father as he opened our Mother Church's Holy Doors today, may we be one in prayer. Merry Christmas! Happy New Year 2025!

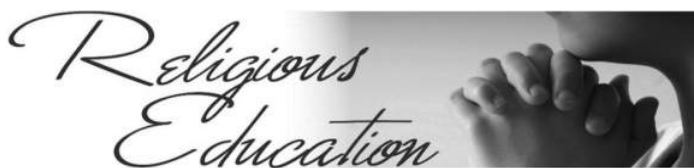

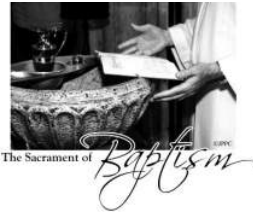
### ALTAR ROSARY SOCIETY

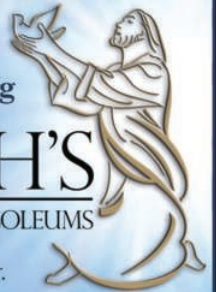
