

**"WHAT MUST WE DO TO BE SAVED?"**

This was basically what Peter was asked when, with the other Apostles, he gave his post-Resurrection homily: "What are we to do, my brothers?" [Acts 2:37b] Many only quote the first four words of his reply: "Repent and be baptized," [2:38], but our first Pope then added a long litany of biblically based 'do's and don'ts.' For 2,000 years, Catholicism has continued that process of applying God's revealed word in Scripture to each generation's questions. One main way she has done this is through a 'Synod' or special meeting of God's People ... but before explaining what a Synod is ...

Thanks to all who remained so faithful, week after week, during the pandemic, either physically or virtually, and whose support of our Parish never waned. And a warm welcome to all who are still in the process of 'coming home' or who are 'testing the waters' by coming to holy Mass today. As we went through so many tough times, so many of you truly 'rose' to the occasion! May the Risen Lord bless us as we reawaken His Body, the Church, from her Covid-induced sleep. Now back to the Synod. In 3 past bulletin articles: 01/16; 02/13 & 02/20 [all past bulletins are available on our website], we explained what a **Synod** is; today we reflect on **Collect option B** [once called the Opening Prayer] for Mass offered before/during a **Synod**:

Collect B - #20 - For A Spiritual or Pastoral Gathering

O God, whose Son promised to all those gathered in his name that he would be there in their midst, grant, we pray, that we may be aware of his presence among us and, in truth and charity, experience in our hearts an abundance of grace, mercy and peace. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

A SYNOD: A MAIN WAY JESUS REMAINS IN OUR MIDST. The Greek word 'synod' means 'journey' or 'way'; the first 'name' in *Acts of the Apostles* for 'Church' was 'the Way,' based on Jesus' invitation to potential disciples: "*Come, and you will see.*" [John 1:39]; as they 'journeyed' with Jesus, they learned 'the way.' **Synodality**, a word

created by Pope Francis, describes this 'process' of 'journeying together' and 'learning by listening' - not only to each other, but more importantly, to God, who reveals Himself primarily through **Scripture and Tradition**: the Bible, and the Church's application of biblical truths to the issues and questions in every age.

So, the 'first synod' was Easter evening as the two disciples walked and conversed with - and listened to - the Risen Lord on 'the way' to Emmaus; however, they were not fully aware of Christ's presence until Jesus 'broke bread' or shared Eucharist with them. A few years later, when decisions had to be made if dietary laws, circumcision and other Jewish rites were still required of Christians, the Apostles FIRST 'listened' to, as we say, 'the word on the street.' Then they convened, 'broke bread' and decided, under the Holy Spirit's inspiration, to forego most Jewish practices. This 'process' has repeated itself countless times over our 2,000-year history; sometimes in obvious ways; sometimes not. The current 'synod' is unique as it was not called to deal with an issue or concern, but to help us get reacquainted with the 'process.'

Here's a brief history; the **Council of Trent** [1545 - 1563], was called - as were the **19 Church Councils** before it - to address/correct valid or erroneous issues; Trent addressed Protestant Reformers. With so many forming their own doctrines and ideas, and the average Catholic being an illiterate migrant worker, the Bishops saw no reason to consult them; this was also true at the 1860's **First Vatican Council**. But at the **1962-1965 Second Vatican Council**, regular synods were called for since many Catholics are now educated and active in the Church; nor did the Bishops want centuries, decades or years to pass without everyone being invited to be part of the 'process.'

So, Pope Francis called a **Synod on Synodality** to help re-acquaint us with this biblically based, time-honored, churchy 'process' that is intended - NOT to create new policies, formulate new dogmas, or declare new 'truths' - but to help all of us get better at respectfully listening to each other and, more importantly, to the revealed truths in sacred **Scripture and Church Tradition**. 
ANNUAL CATHOLIC Appeal 2022
