

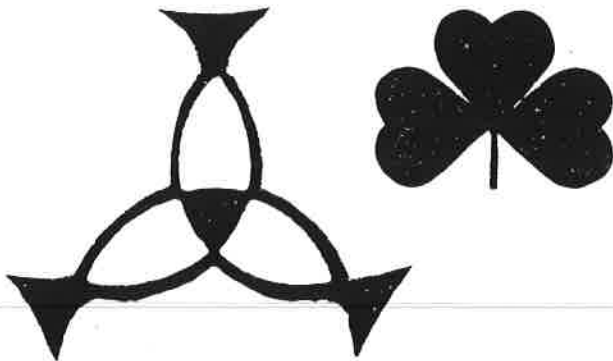

JUNE 13—ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

St. Anthony of Padua lived in the Thirteenth Century. He was born in Portugal. St. Anthony had a reputation as a confessor and preacher. His ministry in Padua, Italy, gave him the now familiar title, St. Anthony of Padua.



Anthony was a friend and companion of the great Francis of Assisi. Legend tells us that the two had much in common. Everyone knows the famous story of how St. Francis preached to the birds and animals. There is a similar story about St. Anthony and how, when people refused to listen to him preach, he preached to the fish, which listened attentively.

For reasons that are no longer clear, Anthony became and remains the patron saint of all careless people, especially those who lose things—a category which takes in almost the entire human race.

Many people might remember this traditional prayer:

*Good St. Anthony, look around.
Something's lost and can't be found.*

JUNE 14—FLAG DAY

On June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress adopted the original form of the flag. In 1916, June 14 was established as Flag Day by a proclamation of Woodrow Wilson. "...one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."
