June, July and August

SUMMER REMINDERS

be beneficial to have a day to spend alone with each child. Since this is not always feasible, a few hours scheduled with each child several times over the course of the summer should be your goal. This practice is important for all families, but becomes a necessity with children who are more than four years apart in age.

Make sure children are properly supervised.
Working parents have to be sure that the
children are not only safe during their absence, but also have things to do. This takes
planning, creativity and cooperation from
everyone who is involved, including the adult

or adults responsible for your children.

Prepare raining day activities.
 A long, wet summer can be the perfect climate for growing young couch potatoes. Be on guard.
